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IQAC REPORT ON ANALYSIS FEEDBACK OF STAKEHOLDERS

Feedback from students is very effective tool in understanding their opinion about the University environment as well as their expectations from the Institute. Feedback from students had always been beneficial for the overall holistic development of the institution. It was used for facilitating the teaching learning process and various programs were organized for students development, counselling, and safety environment in the University campus.

Structured feedback was taken to get the opinion of the students, alumni and teachers on the curriculum through online machines using Google Forms. The questionnaire for feedback was designed on parameters like the difficulty level, relevance, practical application and employability skills embedded in the current curriculum. The questionnaire was filled by all stakeholders including students, alumni and teachers. The schedules were announced using social media platforms and notices were given to the departments regarding the opening and closing dates. The feedback was then collected and analysed. The suggestions given by students were taken into consideration and shared with the teachers. The IQAC Coordinator Dr. (Mrs) Rajeshwari Rana analyses and the suggestions received from students on the feedback and took necessary measures.

The students 'feedback was satisfactory with curriculum offered by Rani Durgavati University, Jabalpur, Madhya Pradesh. The students suggested the need of field visits, hands on experience and academic flexibility to learn interdisciplinary subjects. 


Fig. 1 Students' feedback on curriculum




Fig. 2 Teachers' feedback on curriculum




Fig. 3 Alumni feedback on curriculum
